Our History

Empowerment Resources Inc. (ERI) is a private 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization, established in 2002. The mission is to focus on making children and their families stronger while empowering them to become successful leaders in the community today, for a better tomorrow. We rely on volunteers to run the organization. We have four programs *Journey Into Womanhood*, life-skill workshops for male and female teens, mini retreats and parenting consulting/education classes!

Journey Into Womanhood (JIW) began in June 2003. This rites of passage program has been designed with concepts targeted specifically for female adolescents and addresses the issues that plague girls and their voyage into womanhood. Journey Into Womanhood promotes leadership development in teen girls ages 9-17 and addresses the real issues youth are faced with today. The sessions include workshops, enrichment trips and community service projects. Some workshops are co-facilitated with community agencies and businesses. These businesses and leaders dedicate their service on a volunteer basis. This unique and inspiring program cultivates young ladies and in addition to increasing their self-awareness, leadership development and understanding of twelve vital aspects of life which includes:

The Value of SELF: Understanding the need to love thyself

Our Society Social Constructs: Understanding racism and prejudice, respect for other cultures

Drug and Alcohol: Prevention the effects of drug and alcohol abuse

Food & Nutrition: Learning healthy ways of eating and how to select nutritious foods

Concepts of Beauty: How to care for self, what is beauty, personal hygiene

Employment and Career Skills: Preparing a resume, how get the career you want

"A" is for Academics: Learning proper study habits, college preparation & public speaking

Community Building: Hands-on learning of the importance of giving back by volunteering

Health & Fitness: Learning the importance of exercise & maintaining a healthy lifestyle

Abstinence/STD Prevention: Learning the pros of waiting, how toavoid risky behavior

Relationships/Social Skills: Respecting elders, understanding friendships, and developing social skills

Investments and Savings: Understanding the difference and importance between the two

YEAR IN REVIEW

Journey Into Womanhood 2008-2009 Success Stories/News:

JIW attended a Jacksonville Jaguar Football game by completing several tasks including; a workshop on food and nutrition from 4-H EFNEP, pledging to remain free from tobacco, drugs and alcohol use, goal setting and community service.

JIW viewed the documentary, "Africa's Daughters," directed by Natalie Halpern, a story of two Ugandian girls who dream of moving themselves and their families out of the hands of poverty. After a question and answer session with Halpern, JIW members put their thoughts on paper and wrote letters to the girls featured in the documentary to share how much the film impacted them.

JIW travelled to Tallahassee, Florida for the *College Tour* of Florida A&M University and Florida State University. Upon setting their feet on Tallahassee's soil, they were greeted by District 14's House of Representative, Mia Jones.

Sophomore, Ashley Irven earned a place in UNF/Jaguar Foundation Honor Rows Mentoring program.

Alumni Erica Mitchell and Sanitra Livingston participated in the UNF/Jaguar Foundation Honor Rows Mentoring Program with a scholarship to UNF.

JIW sponsored its group community service project, the "Mayor's Holiday Festival".

All youth are required and encouraged to give back to the community through volunteerism.

JIW adopted six families from Community Connections. Members agreed to donate a few dollars from their allowance and paychecks to buy gifts for families in need.

JIW participated in the 2008 election process by volunteering to get people registered to vote, making calls encouraging people to vote and making posters about voting.

JIW Alumni Erica Mitchell earned a scholarship to study abroad in Ghana, West Africa, for 18 days from May 7-28, as a part of the Ghana Project 2009 from UNF. Her journey was made possible thanks to the generosity of a \$3,000 scholarship from the Jaguars Foundation, \$1,500 scholarship from UNF, as well as a donation from ERI.

JIW Alumni Sanitra Livingston was awarded a \$1,000 scholarship at the 28th Annual Dr. Martin Luther King Scholarship luncheon, at UNF, from Dr. Ben Carson.

ERI served over 400 youth and families year-to-date with the JIW program, outreach, and contract work with churches and other agencies.

This year is dedicated in memory of *Tamika S. Stewart* and *Soloman Stanford*, two angels who continue to watch over us.
